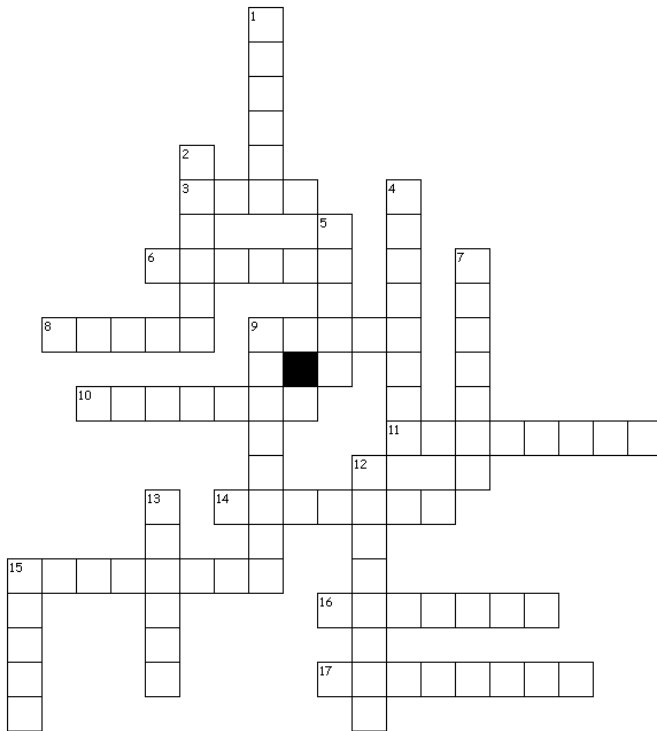

Ebola: A Disease On The Move

Ebola was first diagnosed in the United States in a person when he had travelled from Africa to Dallas, Texas. The patient did not have symptoms when leaving West Africa, but developed symptoms approximately five days after arriving in the United States. The disease Ebola is a hemorrhagic fever, it is a rare and deadly disease caused by infection with one of the Ebola virus strains. Ebola can cause disease in humans and nonhuman primates (monkeys, gorillas, and chimpanzees).

Most people don't know a lot about Ebola and that is why they are so afraid and the news and press are putting out fake things about Ebola to scare people so you have to be careful about what you read. According to the CDC (Center for Disease Control) you can't get Ebola through air, water, or food. You can only get Ebola through touching the blood or body fluids of a person who is sick with or has died from Ebola or by touching infected animals, their blood, other body fluids, or their meat. Finally, the symptoms of Ebola are fever, headache, diarrhea, vomiting, stomach pain, muscle pain, and unexplained bleeding or bruising.
